President Gail sez: “The time has come once again to begin growing orchids, to fill in your already existing collection or just to satisfy your curiosity. The Cape and Islands Orchid Society’s annual auction offers you just such an opportunity on Sunday, October 17 at 1:00 P.M. at the Barnstable County Fairgrounds Administration Building on Route 151 in East Falmouth, MA.

Come early to look over the large variety of plants ranging from beginner to those requiring more experience. By coming early, you will be able to ask questions, to make notes, to have some refreshments and to talk with others. Society members will be present and willing to answer questions, help with selections and give helpful growing hints.

There will be a **great range** of orchids donated by members and by vendors who are experts in their fields, vendors who take part in our January show. We'll have cattleyas fit for a royal ball, phalaenopsis (moth orchids), paphiopedilums (lady slipper orchids) and others. There will be gift certificates, orchid supplies, and framed botanical prints of orchids, 14in. wide x 18 in. long, in gold frames, matted, with glass. New additions arrive until the last minute.

There will be hundreds of plants to choose from. Remember- at an auction there is a very good chance of picking up quality plants at a good price. When the bidding goes up, it's usually by a seasoned grower for a rare plant, but the prices are still good. It's easier than going to the Florida swamps or Peru!”

New proposed Rules Revision 9-27-2010 (Treasurer Jack Martinelli)
