\*(FYI - (PURPOSE:\_The Trophy shall be given to encourage the growing of better quality hybrids and species and to encourage their culture.

RULES: The Trophy may be given at any show at which its issuance is authorized by the Orchid Digest.

The Orchid Digest Trophy shall be given to only one exhibit at each show.

The Orchid Digest Show Trophy may be awarded by a team consisting of a minimum of five judges, accredited when possible, to one noncommercial (as defined by the show schedule) orchid exhibit displaying the highest levels of: *I*. Artistry, taste and innovation in design and presentation 2. Flower quality 3.cultural excellence.

Judges may also consider the exhibit's educational value and the rarity of the plant materials. The definition of "high flower quality" is to be taken from the American Orchid Society judging forms for hybrids and species. It shall not be presumed that this trophy will be awarded at every show at which it is available, but that it will be awarded only to exhibits of outstanding high quality.)

Your orchid society can choose the reason for the award: excellent work as the newsletter or webpage editor; bringing in the most show-and-tell plants to monthly meetings; signing up the most new members, for example."

**Members**; please be aware you <u>can not</u> enter the same plant for judging in multiple shows, though it can be used in the display it just can not be judged. So it is important to send the plant to an event when it is in optimal bloom (like that is possible).

#### Peter Cochrane weighs in again: Muse #3

"In my ongoing quest to get some kind of a handle on this business of growing orchids, I find I am often left wondering about the life cycle of the genera that I have in my collection.

Some grow then bloom; others will wait a season and bloom and others will bloom twice in one year, etc. A very confusing growing pattern but my understanding is that we don't really need to know unless we want to grow flowers for Christmas for example. What I find is essential is to know when to water and when not to, and also when to fertilize them.

My basic parameter is that all new growth begins in the spring. Then the question is, in its natural habitat, will it be a wet or dry period. Likewise, what will the weather be in the following seasons? To get some particular information on that point, I went on line as a tourist would looking for a vacation in the two orchid growing areas of interest. Botanica and Growing Orchids, Book 2 by J.N.Rentoul gave me this information on Cattleyas and Coelogyne. The tourist offices in both cases provide temp. and rainfall all through a typical year, in graphical form. It turns out in both cases the summers are hot and wet, and the winters cold and dry for both of these genera. So, I may proceed with confidence-----for now." Peter C.
