Orchiata Bark Fund Raiser

Hey folks!

So, as you likely know, and if you don't know about this, please pay attention, our annual show and sale is coming up soon! Setup is starting around January 16 with lots of opportunities for volunteering!

The show is a lot of things! It's a lot of fun, a lot of work, a lot of orchids, and a lot of opportunities to help before, during, and after the show.

One way you can help before the show is by helping bag media. Because we don't have a supply vendor coming this year and because CAIOS needs income to be able to keep bringing speakers, renting facilities, paying for insurance, and sundry other things, those of us on the Board thought a good fundraiser would be to buy Orchiata orchid bark in the larger 35 liter bags and break them down into the commonly-seen, smaller-sized 5 liter bags. Selling these at fair market prices would bring a profit for the society and we could add a couple bucks too because it is a fundraiser. We are also getting 150-gram bundles of New Zealand sphagnum moss to sell. We had hoped to get the sphagnum in larger quantities and break those down into smaller sizes, but currently, it is only available in the 150 g size and the price is good.

Oh, right, back to telling you, yes you, a member (or prospective member) of the Cape and Islands Orchid Society (CAIOS) how much I admire and appreciate you and that you're looking particularly healthy/lovely/handsome/smart/well-dressed/{insert your own custom phrase here}/none of the above/other you look/smell/seem/exude today?

Anyways, back to the Orchiata. As a wonderful, kind, smart, helpful, delightful member (or prospective member) of CAIOS, we need your help breaking down those big bags of Orchiata into smaller bags. We hope to have bagging "parties" (?) with beverages, snacks, and anything you care to bring and CAIOS would love it if you were there to help! Speaking of bringing things, if you have whole (no holes) paper bags that we could use so that we don't have to pay for bags.... See? That's the smart thing I was talking about before. Plus, if you volunteer to help bag media, you'll be able to get Orchiata sooner and with a smaller fundraiser markup rather than a show and fundraiser markup....

Tuesday Jan.16 2024: Moving Day

Need folks mid-morning with trucks and larger vehicles at Falmouth storage.

- Weather dependent, move Show equipment from storage facility in Falmouth area to event venue,
- Set up lights, CAIOS display infrastructure, Judging Equipment, Hospitality Room.

Wednesday Jan 17, 2024

- Tuesday tasks if weather didn't cooperate
- Anyone with Orchid Plants should deliver their plants mid-morning to early afternoon so plant grooming and label making can be accomplished early as possible
- Mark all Plants with your Name and Phone # with marker & or tape
- Do you want to enter it for ribbon judging? If you do and can review the Judging Schedule on the caios.org website for what you believe is the correct category for each orchid you wish to register. These will be posted as soon as they arrive from judging team.
- Plant Registration forms will be available at caios.org Show page under Plant Registration tab; these will be posted as soon as they arrive from judging team. There will be people on site to help with this task as it can take some practice.

Thursday January 18, 2024: Create Displays & Data Entry for Plant Judging

- Plants for CAIOS display must be delivered by 10am on Thursday to guarantee inclusion in the display.
- Orchid plant entries for Judging close at 4:00pm Thursday. *Note this may be moved forward to 5 PM Wednesday*.
- Insure your plant is registered for Plant Judging by 4pm you should see a white tag attached to your plants in the display.
- There are lots of jobs for everyone during this daylong set-up.

- CAIOS will continue to have a Hospitality Room as we have in the past for lunch. Coffee & Tea service will be available in the main event room through the day.
- If you can, please bring hot, cold foods, deserts etc. to share in the hospitality room (This day plus Saturday and Sunday - We will have a Signup sheet for Saturday & Sunday at the next two meetings).
