Classic Cattleya Arthur E Chadwick



Arthur E Chadwick holds a BS in Electrical Engineering from North Carolina State and an MBA from James Madison University. He founded Chadwick & Son Orchids Inc in 1989 with his father who had been growing orchids since 1943. The Chadwick's first book, The Classic Cattleyas, from 2006 sold out and an updated second

edition was released last year. Martha Stewart favorably reviewed the book and had both Chadwick's on her TV Show. A second book, *First Ladies and their Cattleyas: A Century of Namesake Orchids*, is scheduled for 2023. The Chadwick's have the distinction of naming Cattleya hybrids after the wives of the six most recent U.S. Presidents and personally presenting the flowers to most of the honored recipients. Chadwick and Son Orchids operates 11 greenhouses in

rural Powhatan County, two retail stores in Richmond, and boards over 13,000 orchids for local clients. The company was recently featured in Southern Living magazine, The New York Times, Bloomberg News, Smithsonian magazine, Better Homes and Gardens, The Washington Post, The CBS Evening News, and Oprah magazine.

Art is a 'regular' on the orchid society speaker's circuit and has spoken at two World Orchid Conferences - France 2005 and Ecuador 2017. For twenty years, he wrote a monthly orchid advice column that was carried by newspapers around the country. January meeting. About 27 members attended and saw an excellent talk by our very own Mike Lincoln. He provided a highly informative talk/demonstration on how he grows orchids in perlite. This approach is semi-hydroponic in that there are no organic materials in the potting mix and the pots are constructed such that about 3/4" of water remains in the pot and is free to wick upwards (via capillary action) to the roots. This approach requires a fertilizing approach that supplies complete nutrition for the orchids as there is no organic matter in the media to breakdown and supply needed trace elements (think MSU formulation plus cal/mag treatment). His results speak for themselves.

There were a surprising number of plants (3 tables worth) on the show table, given that

A conservative estimate is that 800 people attended this year's show (base on ticket sales [door cash and on-line] plus a rough guess at the number of other societies' members installing and/or taking down displays but does not include tickets purchased with a credit card at the door). We would like to thank the Emerald Resort and Hyport Conference Center, the American Orchid Society Northeast Judging Center, our vendors, exhibitors and our many members who volunteered before, during and after the show for helping us produce a memorable show. Many members contributed plants to the display, as well as, their efforts in setting up the conference center, our society display, staffing various stations throughout the show and helping take down the show. As always, our fearless show chair, Tina Balog, made a complex and time-consuming job seem simple and easy. The team of Joanna Eckstrom and Ginna

Plude ably served as Ribbon Judging Chair and saw that task to fruition with little drama in spite of computer and printer problems.

AOS judging resulted in four awards. The Massachusetts Orchid Society display received the AOS Show trophy with a score of 83 points. There were three individual awards: *Maxillaria miniata* 'Jennifer' CCE 93 points (it had gotten a CCM of 83 points 8 yrs ago) exhibited by Chuck and Sue Anderson of the New Hampshire Orchid Society; Oncidium Misaki Twinkle Obry 'Only You' AM 82 points exhibited by Anca Pitigoi of CAIOS (her first AOS award!); and Phrag Yelva Myhre 'Tristan' AM 83 points exhibited by Tina Balog of CAIOS (not her first AOS award!). The CAIOS display took the *The Orchid Digest* Show Trophy that is given to recognize artistry and innovation in orchid display design and presentation and the best of show trophy for most innovative display.

The show expanded to 15 plant displays (up from 11 last year) with the CAIOS display providing the central focus. The number of vendors increased to six (up from 4 last year) with two new vendors, Ecuagenera and White Plains Orchids, joining us and Frosty Hollow Orchids joining us after missing last year. Hall vendors were greatly increased, thanks in great part to the efforts of Lee Drescher. The following members contributed plants to the CAIOS Display: Tina Balog, Tom Gregg, Bob Findlay, Kelly Grinnan, Mike Lincoln, Charles Black, Leslie James, Anca Pitigoi, Bill Golden, Brian Leib, Forest Henderson. Dick and Eleanor Phillips installed their own display. All CAIOS members' plants that earned ribbons at the show are listed on the last three pages of the newsletter.
